ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

We can apply the last words of the gospel to ourselves today "He has made the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak". In curing the deaf mute Jesus touched the man's ears and said "ephpheta" an Aramaic word that means "be opened". Immediately the deaf mute heard the word of Jesus and spoke to others about Him even at the risk of persecution.

What would you think if that deaf mute deliberately deprived himself of his hearing and speech after he was miraculously cured? That is exactly what the Catholic who gives up the practice of his faith does! At Baptism the same word "ephpheta" was spoken to us by the priest, an "alter Christus". He prayed that our ears would be opened to the Word of God. Let us realize what a great gift this is to know God through His Word and tell others about Him! This is how we fulfill our purpose in life to know, love and serve God so that we can be happy forever with Him in heaven.

St Paul in the epistle is a shining example of hearing and speaking the faith. He had been struck blind on the road to Damascus but by the grace of God his eyes were opened and he became a true apostle of Christ. May we also be able to say,: "His grace has not been Fruitless". O Lord that we may see! We live in a world that disregards and even mocks God as we saw in Paris during the Olympics. Fortunately there has been a lot of complaints from bishops in France and in the USA. Let us truly hear the Word of God and speak that "Word" to others!

Let us be sure to thank God for the gift of our Catholic faith! We saw it in Indianapolis just last month. It is certainly our hope. What would we do without our faith? Yet even more importantly what will we do WITH our faith? Our Lord cured the deaf and dumb man who asked for His help. We too, especially in these uncertain times, living in this anti –culture of death with important state & national elections with the question of whether abortions will be permitted OR NOT, need to ask for His help that we will truly become a God fearing, Pro life nation again! Will there be another chance if we fail?

Archbishop Schnurr on the Olympics Opening Ceremony

"This past Friday, July 26, many of us witnessed the opening ceremony of the Summer Olympics in Paris, which unfortunately featured a grotesque, highly-sexualized parody of DaVinci's iconic painting The Last Supper. This blasphemous display not only gratuitously mocked the faith of the world's 2.6 billion Christians, but Jesus' very institution of the Holy Eucharist, which we Catholics know to be "the source and summit of the Christian life". Here in the *United States, this exhibition was all the more shocking* following, as it did, on the heels of the joyful celebration and worship of Jesus in the Eucharist at the National Eucharistic Congress just one week prior in Indianapolis. Much has been written already on this matter. One particularly good statement that I would commend to your attention is the one below from Bishop Andrew Cozzens, chairman of the National Eucharistic Congress. Bishop Cozzens calls us to a response of prayer, fasting and worship of our Lord in the Mass and adoration – all wonderful disciplines I would highly encourage."
