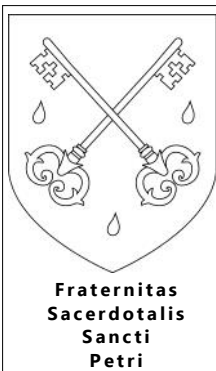

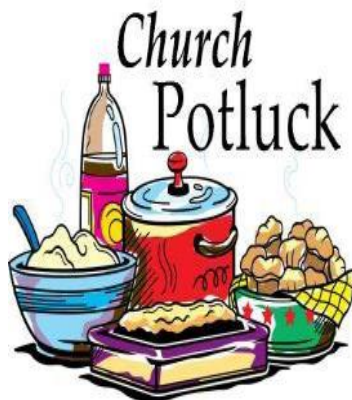

## The Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost



In today's epistle, Gal. 5:25-6:10, St Paul admonishes us "While we have time let us do good to all men." Even if someone is caught doing something wrong we cannot gossip about them. Instead a good Catholic prays for them realizing that we are not perfect either. We must remind ourselves "but for the grace of God there go I!" If someone has done something to

harm us or even just something that annoys us let us remember the words Our Lord Himself worked into the Our Father whereby we set the limits on how much we want God to forgive us by how much we forgive others: "forgive us our trespasses (HOW MUCH?) as we forgive those who trespass against us." By forgiving others we show that the Holy Spirit is alive in us and that WE want to be forgiven as well. Do we recall the A,B C's of Divine Mercy?:

A- Ask for mercy (especially frequent confessions)

B- Be merciful to others (yes even to those we don't care for or even those who have injured us)

C- Confidence ! Completely trust in God

**REMEMBER the words of Our Lord on the Mount?**  
**Blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy!**
