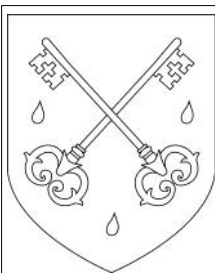

The Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost

HAPPY BIRTHDAY BLESSED MOTHER!



Today we celebrate the Feast of the birthday of our Blessed Mother! This feast originated after the Council of Ephesus (431 AD), which confirmed her right to the title of “Theotokus”, the “God Bearer”, “the Mother of God”. It is related to the Feast of the Immaculate Conception that was celebrated exactly nine months previous. Mary was descended from the royal family of David from her father’s (St. Joachim) side as is depicted so beautifully in

the apse of Holy Family. She is also of the priestly line of Aaron from her mother, St. Anne. Today Salvation History sees its first hope in this little human baby destined to be the Mother of God and as Wordsworth called her “our tainted nature’s solitary boast”! She is the new Eve who will make us able to become true “children of God” through the fruit of her womb, Our Lord Jesus Christ. Let us present her with flowers and pray a rosary today, as she asks us to do daily, but today especially in her honor now Queen of Heaven and Earth and our Blessed Mother! *“Thy Nativity, O Virgin Mother of God, was the herald of joy to the whole world; since from thee arose the Son of Justice, Christ Our God, who destroying the curse, bestowed the blessing and confounding death, rewarded us with life everlasting.”* (from the breviary).
