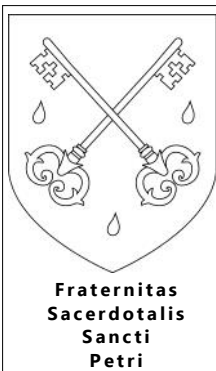

The Seventeenth Sunday After Pentecost

In today's Gospel, MT 22:35-46, Our Lord responds to the Pharisee's question "which is the great commandment of the law?" by saying "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul and with thy whole mind" and "thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." Jesus then asks "What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is he?" At first these appear to be separate subjects with nothing in common, a non sequitur. But a closer grasp of its meaning show they are intimately connected. The real reason why the Pharisees rejected Jesus and condemned Him to be crucified was because they had not the true love of God within them. They served God out of selfish motives, they wanted to prosper in their earthly possessions and to avoid earthly punishments. They devoted their time to twisting the Law of Moses in order to circumscribe God's activity among men. They left God little to say in His own Law. They wanted a Messiah who would free them from the Roman occupiers and restore to them the Jewish ruling power, THEIR POWER, over Israel. They did not think of the Messiah's spiritual mission of conquering sin and death. They wanted a great worldly wizard who would open the doors of earthly treasures to them without even considering the gates of heaven. Because they did not love God as they should—with their whole heart and soul— they would not recognize Him before their very eyes and would not accept Him as their Lord and Redeemer. They preferred their heaven on earth! How little the world has changed in nearly 2000 years. There are legions of worldly men and women, among them many who call themselves "Catholic" yet deny giving themselves whole heartedly to Jesus Christ for the same motives. Let us not be a part of that group but rather continue to increase in love of God and our neighbor for the love of God who created each and every one in His image and likeness and died for their redemption. We must remember we are created for heaven not this earth!

Remember those words of St Therese the Little Flower :

"The earth's my ship - not my home!"

The Crucifixion (St. Matthew 27:46)

The taking down of the Body of Jesus from the Cross.

The burial of Jesus. St. Matthew 27:60)

Let us remember and meditate on the Sorrows of Our Blessed Mother especially on her feast day.. When we are grieving let us turn to her who knows grief more than any other human and she will comfort you!
