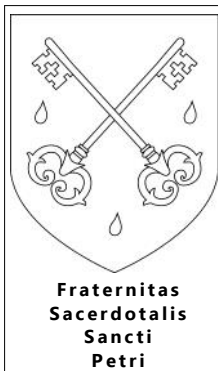

Second Sunday After Epiphany

The Wedding Feast of Cana

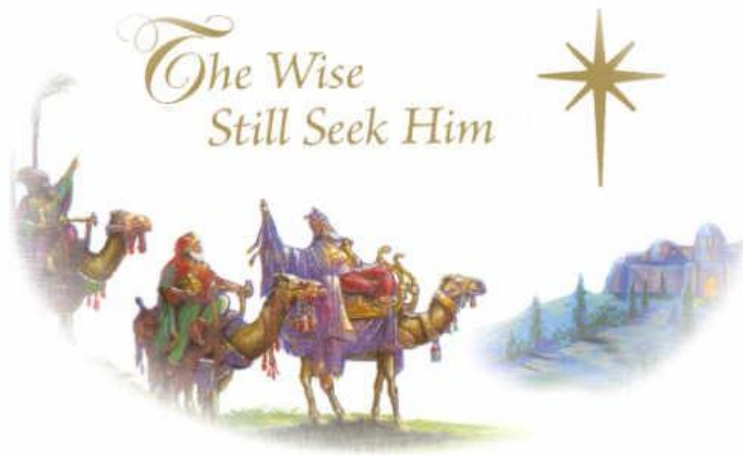
In today's Gospel, on this Second Sunday after Epiphany, Holy Mother Church presents to us the third "epiphany" that Greek word which means "a manifestation".

The Fathers of the Church go even further by calling the three events "theophanies" "manifestations of God" as they give evidence to us who this Jesus is, a proof of His divinity. The first theophany was the coming of the magi, gentiles bringing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, significant gifts that show His kingship, His priesthood and the death he will die to redeem mankind. They answer a spiritual call that makes them put aside their normal lives and cross a desert bearing precious gifts for this King of Kings!

They were not disappointed!

The second theophany is the Baptism of Jesus which was celebrated last Monday on the former octave day of the epiphany, Jan. 13th. Here we read that 30 years after His birth, as Jesus was preparing for His public life, He came to St. John the Baptist and was baptized in the Jordan River where the Holy Ghost came down upon Him in the form of a dove. The voice of God the Father is heard saying "Behold My beloved Son!" St. John then testifies "I have seen & born witness that this is the Son of God".

Today we have the third theophany where Jesus performs His first of many miracles at the Wedding Feast of Cana through the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the same time as manifesting His divine supernatural power he also manifests His great love for the institution of marriage. Let us be sure to remember this occasion, the first miracle of Our Lord, whenever our protestant friends wrongfully say that Mary was "just another woman" or question why we "worship" her. Remind them that we do not worship her like we do God but rather honor her above all creatures, as the "Theotokos", the "Mother of God", whose intercession it was that brought about that first miracle. She merely states "vinum non habent", "they have no wine" and Her Divine Son, flesh of her flesh, turns mere wash water into the best wine man has ever tasted while also foreshadowing the Holy Eucharist where He will turn wine into His blood for us! **ALL PROOFS JESUS IS GOD!**



On this second Sunday after Epiphany you may be wondering why the manger scene and the Christmas decorations are still on display. After all the rest of the world—if they did celebrate Christmas—had their Christmas trees out by the side of the road Dec 26th! Saying “Glad that’s over!?!?” Here at Holy Family we mentioned throughout Advent to “Keep Christ in Christmas but keep Christmas out of Advent!” Our celebration begins at Christmas and goes throughout the Christmas season which in the Traditional Latin Calendar ends on Feb. 2nd with the Feast of the Purification also known as Candlemas.

So please continue celebrating the Birth of Our Lord with us! (Lent will be here before you know it!) St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother did not just leave Jesus in Bethlehem and go back to “business as usual”. Oh NO! they took the Baby Jesus with them back home to Nazareth and watched HIM grow and loved Him more and more every day!!! Let us do the same!!

EPIPHANY WATER IN THE FRONT ENTRANCE
Parishioners are encouraged to bring EMPTY bottles to fill from the large containers that were blessed on the vigil of the Epiphany. The actual blessing takes 45 minutes which includes the Litany of the Saints and two exorcisms of the salt and water! This indicates how powerful this sacramental is! It is available for your personal use! Perhaps you saw an e-mail showing the picture of a beautiful house in Altadena CA, with all his neighbors houses burned to the ground. He credits his house being saved to the Epiphany Water he sprinkled on it!! Now DO NOT TRY THIS AT HOME but it does illustrate the power of this great sacramental Holy Mother Church offers us!
